

Honey Jar Instruction


Your Honey Jar kit contains a packet of herbs and curios that are traditionally believed to “sweeten” a person toward you. I’ve also added uncrossing roots and herbs, and additional ingredients believed to give you mastery and make you more alluring to the person for whom the Honey jar is intended.

You need a piece of paper to write your PETITION. Traditionally, this should be brown paper—like from a paper bag, but can be any paper. The size should be fairly small, around 4” x 4” square.

To work the honey jar all you need is:

- One small red candle
- A small jar with screw-on lid
- Honey, syrup, molasses
- This packet of ingredients. If you don’t have the ingredients, you can use any of the following: rose petals, cinnamon, ginger, cardamom, cherry bark, lavender, queen Elizabeth root, rosemary, tonka bean, catnip, mint, mandrake root, and a whole lot of other herbs which can be found with a little research.
- A picture of the person you’re working the jar for
- A picture of yourself
- A plate on which to place the Honey Jar
- A “personal concern” from your target. Ideally, this should be a hair. A fingernail clipping will do, or a fragment from an article of clothing. Something from the person works best. As a last resort, you can use a signature or a picture, but the results won’t be as reliable.
- If you’re constructing the honey jar as a love attraction spell, to attract an unknown man unto your life with certain characteristics, instead of a specific name write a petition describing your ideal man. List the characteristics you want in this man.

Fill the jar half way with honey, add the contents of the packet, and stir. Finish filling the jar and stir again.



Write your PETITION on the back of the paper Write your name three times (some people prefer nine times, as shown), turn the paper ninety degrees, and write your target’s name three times so it crosses yours. The petition is now written in a circle around the crossed names, and should be written in the present tense. A simple petition would be: *“John Smith, you love me and want to be my lover.”* Write it several times if necessary to close the circle. Place the personal concern in the paper, fold the paper and place it in the jar.

Take out a small amount of the honey with a spoon and eat it, saying *“As this honey tastes sweet to me, so will I become sweet to John Smith (say your target’s name).”* You can do this three times, and then screw the lid on tightly. Place the jar on the pictures of you and your targets on the plate.

With a pin or needle, inscribe the name of whom you're working on the candle. Fix the candle to the lid of the Honey Jar or use a small candle holder. It's traditional to burn the candle on Monday, Wednesday and Friday until it burns out. Do it for as long as it takes, and add another candle if you wish.

The wax from the candles will melt on and eventually cover the Honey Jar, and this should be allowed.

Disposing of a Honey Jar is done in several ways. If it's successful and you get your lover, you can cook with the honey and feed it to them. If you want to release the work gently, take the Honey Jar to an ant hill, open it, and let the ants have it, asking them to take the sweetness to all your friends everywhere. If the spell failed, you can take the jar to running water, rinse it out, and recycle the jar.
